WHS to create alumni museum

Woodstock High School is requesting items for display as part of a new WHS alumni museum, which could open as early as the end of this school year.

"We're trying to establish a greater alumni association," said Corey Tafoya, principal at WHS. The school hopes to unveil the museum during graduation weekend, he said, but plans are not concrete.

Until Woodstock North High School opened, WHS had used all available classroom space. With district high school students split between WHS and WNHS, a few classrooms opened up, providing school officials the opportunity to put them to new uses.

The museum will be located on the 300 level of WHS, in an older class-room Tafoya said was not as conducive to learning as other classrooms.

"We had to use it before, and now we don't," Tafoya said.

The school has some items it plans to display. Old photos, yearbooks dating back to the early 1900s and mementos such as old report cards are stored in a cabinet in the room.

"We have to go through the building," Tafoya said. "There are a lot of things we can display better."

An important part of the museum will be securing items from former graduates who are willing to donate or display them, Tafoya said. A request for items was posted on the school's Facebook page.

"We're looking for whatever Woodstock High School memorabilia people are willing to share," Tafoya said. He envisions old football helmets and letter jackets dotting the walls.

"It's our job to save whatever we can," Tafoya said. "It's meaningful to a

In addition to wall displays, a sitting area will be available for alumni to thumb through old yearbooks and photo albums.
